## Maths

**R** Counting, ordering and comparing numbers to 20. Being able to say which number is 1 more or less than another number. Practice and develop oral and mental skills. Estimating. Problem solving. To solve practical problems using addition and subtraction. Weight and length. Pattern and shape. Continue to count in twos and tens. Understand what sharing and doubling is.

**Y1/2** Addition/subtraction facts. Tens and Units. Problem solving. Doubles. Partitioning. Oral/mental calculations. 2/3D shape and symmetry. Collect and record data. Read a scale. Interpret graphs. Sharing and division. Halves and quarters. Coordinates.

## PE

We will be concentrating on ball skills this term. Throwing, catching, hitting and fielding. Then using these skills within team games.
